

SPOTLIGHT LODGE: AMITY LODGE#

Amity Lodge #166 is located at 456 Hudson Street in Gloucester City, NJ. It was chartered on June 6, 1872 and has been serving the community for the past 138 years. The term Amity comes from the Latin word "amicus" which means friendship, one of the Three Links of our order. And yes, Amity lodge is one of the friendliest lodges.

Originally, Amity Lodge was located in Merchantville, NJ. Eventually, the lodge purchased a building in Pennsauken and the lodge prospered. During those days the lodge was a major focal point in the community, holding various socials and fund raising activities. Membership thrived, reaching well in excess of 100 members, as it did in all Odd Fellows lodges in the 1940's through the 1960's.

As interest and membership declined for the Order in the past forty years or so Amity Lodge declined as well. Ten years ago, the average age of an Amity Lodge member was sixty. The lodge hall in Pennsauken was sold and Amity Lodge began to hold their meetings in Gloucester at the Arwames' Rebekah building.

In 2005, Amity Lodge merged with Senatus Lodge #76.

Senatus Lodge received their Charter in 1848 and they too had a long history of service to the community. Amity Lodge moved into the Senatus Lodge hall in Gloucester City and the members of the two lodges have worked together to form one.

Over the past few years, Amity Lodge has increased its membership to over 50 members and we are continuing to grow. Besides the increase in sheer numbers, it is also important to note that most of these new members are younger people who bring energy and enthusiasm to the order.

Besides this increase in membership, we have again become active in our community. That first event that took place ten years ago was a Christmas Party for underprivileged kids. Now an annual event, our parties have brought joy to countless kids and their families who would not normally have had a Christmas "celebration". The look on those children's faces as they receive gifts from Santa warms our hearts and motivates us to do more. Over the past few years, we have held pancake breakfasts and spaghetti dinners to raise money for various causes. We provide modest scholarships to both of the local high schools to deserving students. We participate in the annual 4th of July parade in Gloucester City with a trailer promoting Odd Fellowship.

Amity Lodge is proud of the several Past Grand Masters within its ranks. They include Joseph Hubbs, Walter Norris, Robert Barrett, Gary Clemmens and Leonard Burger. Other Past Grands from Amity; Irv Holt, Harold Casper, David Johnson Sr, and Don Buchanan, have since passed but are a significant part of the history of the Lodge. Currently, we have several members holding key seats on the Grand Lodge Staff, including Jim Ammann, who is Deputy Grand Master.

Amity Lodge has always been active in Odd Fellowship, and though we have experienced lean times, we are a tribute to what can be accomplished through hard work and dedication.
